Dr. Fatih Sekercioglu and Dr. Jordan Tustin

Fatih Sekercioglu is an Assistant Professor at Ryerson University and Adjunct Professor at Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry at Western University. Before joining Ryerson in 2019, Fatih was a lecturer in the Department of Geography at Western University and an environmental health manager with the Middlesex-London Health Unit. Throughout his 15-year public health career, Fatih worked as an environmental health manager, child and family health manager, vector-borne disease program coordinator and public health inspector. Fatih was a Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (CIPHI) Board of Certification examiner for ten years and the CIPHI National Exam Panel member between 2012-2019. He was appointed as the CIPHI Ontario Board of Certification Representative between May 2018 and July 2019. He has recently been selected as a board member of the Environmental Health Foundation of Canada.

Jordan Tustin is a PhD Epidemiologist and Assistant Professor at Ryerson University in the School of Occupational and Public Health. She is a Canadian Field Epidemiologist fellow, a CIHR Public Health Policy fellow, a Certified Canadian Public Health Inspector, and was awarded with a Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal for her service to public health in Canada and abroad. She has extensive field experience in communicable disease investigations and response at the local, provincial, federal and international level– notably H1N1 (Mexico, Canada), Ebola (Guinea, DRC), and foodborne/waterborne/vaccine preventable diseases (Canada, Cameroon, Sierra Leone). Some of her research interests include vaccine hesitancy, food safety and currently, COVID-19.

Prior to joining the Ministry, he worked for 15 years in the automotive manufacturing sector for three prominent employers in the industry.</p> <p>Paul Bozek is currently an Associate Professor (Teaching Stream) at University of Toronto's Dalla Lana School of Public Health, where he is Program Director for the MPH degree field in occupational & environmental health. He is the Chair of the Canadian Registration Board of Occupational Hygienists ROH Examination Committee, and is Past President of the Occupational Hygiene Association of Ontario. Prior to his academic role, Paul was a consultant for over two decades in the private sector, dealing with occupational health and safety in a variety of industry settings, focusing on exposure control and chemical safety. 
